Ohio Chamber of Commerce PAC continues record-breaking fundraising

COLUMBUS, OHIO – Ohio Chamber President and CEO Steve Stivers today announced the Ohio Chamber of Commerce PAC (OCCPAC) smashed all of its previous fundraising records as it wrapped up a record-breaking year. The OCCPAC raised over \$212,000 in 2021 – more than four times the total amount the PAC has ever raised before in one year. With a cash-on-hand balance of over \$220,000, in less than a year, the Ohio Chamber PAC has more than tripled what would historically be raised for an entire two-year cycle.

"The Ohio Chamber of Commerce is committed to making Ohio the number one state in the country to do business and this record-breaking fundraising year will go a long way to doing just that," Stivers said. "By increasing our political involvement, the Ohio Chamber of Commerce will be able to better support and fight for pro-business elected officials across the state."

Today's announcement comes just seven months after Stivers started in his new role as chamber president, where he has prioritized the mission to grow the organization's impact and voice with key decision makers across Ohio.

"Supporting our pro-business elected officials and candidates is an important part of our mission to make sure that the concerns of our job creators, both small and large, are heard in Columbus," Stivers said. "I am excited to continue our efforts to make Ohio the best place to live and work in the nation."
