





Tornado Relief Emergency Fund Small Business Grant

Purpose: The grant was established by the Ohio Chamber of Commerce in partnership with the Indian Lake Area Chamber of Commerce and Logan County Chamber of Commerce to provide immediate support to small businesses in the Indian Lake Area directly impacted by the tornado event of March 14, 2024, in Logan County, Ohio. This grant serves as a bridge to help businesses in the immediate aftermath of the tornado and before other funding resources become available through insurance, state/federal programs, or other recovery sources.

Grant Amount: Grant awards will be up to \$5,000. Awards will be made based on meeting eligibility requirements and approval by review committee.

Qualified Applicants: For profit and non-profit small business/organizations physically located in Lakeview, Russells Point, Huntsville, Washington Township, or Stokes Township who incurred direct damage to buildings and property during the March 14th tornado. Businesses that did not incur direct physical damage but suffered operational losses will also be eligible. Governmental entities are not eligible.

Permitted uses of grant funds: Pay for standard business operational expenses, insurance deductibles, building repairs, property replacement, sign replacement, replacement of inventory, expenses related to clean-up and temporary operations (ex; generators, dumpsters, debris removal, etc), and other recovery related expenses.

Application Process:

- Applications will be accepted now through April 12th, 2024, with funding decisions being made on a rolling basis.
- Funds are limited and will be awarded on a first come first serve basis to applicants who meet all eligibility requirements and submit a complete application. Grants will be awarded until all funds have been dispersed.
- Only Complete applications, including all supporting documents, will be considered.

- Grant eligibility and awards will be made by a joint committee of the Indian Lake Area Chamber Commerce (minimum 2 reps), Logan County Area Chamber of Commerce (minimum 2 reps), and Ohio Chamber of Commerce (minimum 1 rep)
- Maximum grant request of \$5,000 as supported by evidence of permitted uses.

Note: Businesses applying for the grant should be aware that if they have also received a Small Business Administration (SBA) loan, there is an SBA regulation that generally requires that homeowners receiving compensation for their damaged properties after SBA has disbursed loans for the same properties must send such compensation to SBA to be used as principal payments on their loans. These requirements do not make an exception for HUD CDBG funds, which is considered lower than SBA disaster loans in FEMA's delivery sequence. The Ohio Chamber will work with each recipient to assist with sequencing emergency funds.
